

Founder and President. Stardust and Artist


Molly is an award-winning artist and activist who aims to bring together the collective experiences of many for greater understanding. She believes that connection and thoughtful participation can catalyze powerful change.

Molly's desire to leverage her influence as an investor, as an activist, and as an artist led her to found Stardust, with the hopes of contributing to a more just and equitable world.



Molly is a board member of The Freedom Fund, Children's Rights, Creative Time, and the Wassaic Project, and was named one of New York's New Abolitionists by the New York State Anti-Trafficking Coalition. She holds a BFA in Sculpture from Guilford College.

Bisa Butler

Award-Winning African American Textile Artist

Bisa Butler was born in Orange, New Jersey, the daughter of a college president and a French teacher and the youngest of four siblings.

Formally trained, Butler graduated Cum Laude from Howard University with a Bachelor's in Fine Art degree. At Howard Butler was able to refine her natural talents under the tutelage of lecturers such as Jeff Donaldson, Al Smith Jr and Skunder Boghossian. She began to experiment with fabric as a medium and became interested in collage techniques.

Butler then went on to earn a Master's in Art from Montclair State University in 2005.

While in the process of obtaining her Master's degree, Butler took a Fiber Arts class where she had an artistic epiphany and she finally realized how to express her art through cloth.

Butler was a high-school art teacher for 10 years in the Newark Public Schools and three years at Columbia High School in Maplewood, New Jersey.

Most recently in 2023, Butler had a solo exhibition at the famed Jeffrey Deitch Gallery. She was awarded a Gordon Parks Foundation Fellowship in 2022. Butler's work was the focus of a solo exhibition at the Art Institute of Chicago, the second stop of a traveling exhibit which began at the Katonah Museum of Art. Many institutions and museums have acquired Butler's work including: the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture, the Renwick Gallery of the Smithsonian American Art Museum, and the Los Angeles County Museum of Art among others.





Lorelei Williams

Executive Director Warner Music Group/Blavatnik Family Foundation Social Justice Fund

Lorelei Williams is a poet, proud mama and philanthropic strategist. She currently serves as Executive Director of the Warner Music Group/Blavatnik Family Foundation Social Justice Fund ("SJF"). The ten-year, \$100M fund advances racial justice at the intersection of culture and systemic change. Lorelei has led the Fund in making \$30M+ in commitments, built a global employee giving program across four Warner Music Group markets, and is seeding artist engagement opportunities with SJF grantees.

Prior to joining the SJF, Williams served as Senior Vice President of Grant Programs at Comic Relief U.S., where she managed a \$50M grantmaking portfolio across 38 countries, leveraging the power of entertainment to help address child poverty. Previously, Williams spent more than 15 years working as a philanthropic strategist with a focus on the U.S., South America, and Sub-Saharan Africa. For many of those years, she was Principal of Onira Global Advisors, providing counsel on philanthropic strategy, fundraising, and program design to foundations and nonprofit organizations around the globe.

Lorelei has also served as Co-Chair of the Civil Society Committee for the U.S. State Department's U.S.-Brazil Joint Action Plan to End Racial Discrimination (JAPER).

Williams holds a B.A. from Yale University in Political Science and African American Studies and a master's degree in Public Policy from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government. She loves dancing, writing poetry and traveling throughout the Diaspora with her daughter.
